I would like to thank Mrs Sujata Chaturvedi, Secretary Sports, Govt of India for supporting and encouraging us. Mr LS Singh, Jt Secy Sports, Govt of India who has guided and encouraged us to prioritise classification in para sports.

The National Athletics Championship 2022 is the first Nationals by CPSFI after our recognition as a NSF by the Ministry of Sports, Govt of India.

CPSFI has raised the bar in conduct of Nationals for a para sport event. By bringing in Dr Halim Jebali, IPC Classifier from Tunisia, to assist us in the classification process alongwith Dr Siddharth Aggarwal, Dr Naveen Talwar, Dr SK Taneja, Dr Ankur Upadhyay and their teams. The Delhi Athletics Association supported with their technical officials. A team of medical support with an ambulance was stationed at the venue 24/7, courtesy Medanta.

Mr LS Singh, Jt Secy Sports, visited us during the classification process and spent quality time understanding and discussing on creating a pool of national classifiers in India. He also supported us in getting the venue for our 28th Sangiti, awareness session on 'Classification in Para Sports' by Dr Halim Jebali, which was held at the Conference room of NDTL on 6th May 2022. Mr Singh attended the session alongwith Ms Ritu Sain, DG NADA and Dr PL Sahu, Director NDTL.

Over 250 people participated in the Athletics Championship 2022, with 150 being athletes through our members across India. This Championship was also the platform to identify athletes and induct them into our Lakshya Paralympics Program. The inducted athletes will be high-performance trained and prepared for Paralympics.

My heartfelt thanks to Mr Kapil Dev, the cricket legend, an idol to many, an inspirtation to sports persons, who visited us during the Championship inspite of his busy schedule



I am thankful to all our members who participated and contributed to the success of the event. I look forward to greater participation in the future.

The Department of Sports, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS), Government of India, has recognised CPSFI as a National Sports Federation (NSF) in the 'Priority' category. CPSFI has been mandated to promote and develop sports for persons with cerebral palsy in India.

CPSFI is the only national member of CPISRA & IFCPF.

CPISRA is the leading international sports organisation governing and promoting sport and recreation for Cerebral Palsy (CP) and related neurological conditions. CPISRA is a founding organisation of the Paralympics and one of only four IOSD recognised by the IPC to represent impairment groups.

IFCPF, International Federation of CP Football, is the international governing body for the sport of CP Football and are the 'Recognised International Sport Federation' of IPC.

Vision

Creating Opportunities. Changing lives.

"To create a platform for people with cerebral palsy and related neurological conditions to participate in adaptive sports which help improve their physical, psychological & social well being".

Mission

To pioneer a cerebral palsy sports movement in India.

- By building awareness, nurturing talent, training athletes and creating opportunities for competitions leading to Paralympics.
- Facilitate a cerebral palsy sports experience centre which offers state-of-the-art sports facilities, equipments, technical & classification expertise & sports science support.
- Ensure availability & affordability of sports equipments like frame runner & boccia balls/slides.



CPSFI has set a goal of 25 medals in the category for cerebral palsy in the Paralympics. "Lakshya Paralympics" is an initiative to high performance train athletes who are promising and probables for Paralympics. The National Athletics Championship 2022 was one such platform where athletes are being identified for induction into the "Lakshya Paralympics" program.



Executive Board

The Executive Board of CPSFI comprises of people from all walks of life, young and experienced and from different parts of the country.

CPSFI is led by Rajesh Tomar, graduate from St Stephen's College, Delhi University. He has contributed to the field of sports and para sports extensively. National Athletics Championship 2022

CPSFI conducted National Athletics Championship 2022 from 4 - 7 May 2022. Over 250 persons participated in the event with 150 of them being athletes. The participants were from 16 member States/UTs. They were accommodated at the SAI hostel, JLN Stadium and at the Vishwa Yuvak Kendra. Food, prescribed by the SAI hostel nutritionist was provided at the hostel premises. Medanta, our medical partner provided us with doctor consultation, a physiotherapist, nurses (male and female), first aid kits & emergency medicine & an ambulance during the entire event, round the clock.

Classification of athletes with disability has been the focus point since the Tokyo Paralympics. The Ministry of Sports, Government of India has been encouraging efforts towards classification. Classification is an important process and therefore a priority at CPSFI. We invited Dr Halim Jebali, IPC Classifier from Tunisia to help us in the classification of athletes, to ensure the athletes are classified in the right class when they begin. Dr Siddharth Aggarwal, Dr Naveen Talwar, Dr SK Taneja, Dr Ankur Upadhyay with their team helped in the classification process along with Dr Jebali.

CPSFI approached the Athletic Federation of India (AFI) for qualified technical officials' support for the conduct of the Championship. The Delhi Athletics Association, member of AFI, deputed 24 qualified technical officials to help us in the process.

The first two days (4th & 5th May) were for registration and classification. The next two days were for the events (6th & 7th May). Mr Kapil Dev visited the venue on 4th May, interacted with the athletes/officials and the classification team. It was inspiring and motivational for the athletes.

5th May

Mr LS Singh, Jt Secy, Ministry of Sports visited the venue. He spent quality time understanding the classification process with Dr Jebali. Ways to qualitatively improve the classification process in India was discussed. Mr Singh also tied his hand at Boccia. He was explained about the need for indigenously manufacturing the balls to bring down the cost of the equipment when imported from Europe. Boccia is a cp sport for persons with high support needs (on wheelchair).

The opening ceremony of the Championship was in the evening under flood light, lasting for about an hour. Shri Sriram Singh, Olympian, 800 m finalist in the 1976 Montreal Olympics was the chief guest along with Dr Jebali. The guests lit the lamp to mark the beginning of the Championship and Mr Rajesh Tomar, President CPSFI declared the Championship open to releasing of balloons and cheering from the participants. In his opening speech, Mr Tomar introduced the CPSFI Executive Board to the audience. The athletes/coaches & escorts proudly marched to the beat of The Colonel Bogey. Athletes from 16 member States/UTs participated and a bunch of them participated under the CPSFI banner.



Members of the Delhi State Mallakhamb Association demonstrated Mallakhamb. Mallakhamb is a traditional sport originating from India, in which a gymnast performs aerial yoga or gymnastic postures. The ceremony ended with the vote of thanks by Ms Kavita Suresh, General Secretary CPSFI.

6th May & 7th May

The track & field events were conducted in the early hours of the morning (6 am to 9 am) and the late hours of the evening (6 pm to 9 pm) so the heat during the day does not take a toll on the athletes. The technical officials were responsible for the conduct of the events. A total of 32 events (21 men & 11 women) were conducted. The medal ceremonies were conducted on the same days after the event. Certificate of Merit will be given only to the winning athletes who have met the MQS. Certificate of Merit will not be issued to athletes who have won medals but not met the MQS, since the qualifying criteria during registration was the MQS. The medals were still given as a gesture of encouragement.

6th May 2022

CPSFI conducted Sangiti, our awareness sessions, on Classification in Para Sports by Dr Jebali. The session was hosted at the National Dope Testing Laboratory (NDTL) conference room. NDTL is a premier analytical testing & research organisation established under Government of India.

The session was attended by Mr LS Singh, Jt Secy, Ministry of Sports, Ms Ritu Sain, Director General NADA (National Anti-Doping Agency), Dr P L Sahoo, Director NDTL and over 45 persons (coaches/managers representing our members pan India).

As an outcome of deliberations with Mr LS Singh, Dr Jebali and the CPSFI officials, it's been agreed that CPSFI will initiate a workshop on Classification with the help of the Ministry, 8th -10th December 2022. Dr Jebali during the discussion with the Jt Secy, Ministry of Sports suggested a 3-day workshop to create a pool of national classifiers which will be conducted by IPC classifiers-educators. This will result in having trained classifiers in India who can ensure classification is 95% correct when the athletes represent India in International events.

7th May 2022

The Championship concluded in the evening with a jumbled march past by all the athletes/coaches/escorts/volunteers/technical officials and CPSFI officials. The entire team posed together for a memorable picture and then danced away to music. The Kerala team was announced as the winners of the Ramesh Tikaram Memorial Award for the Best Team by Mr Rajesh Tomar. The trophy was given away by Mr Tomar and Dr Jebali.

Some teams departed the same evening and some the next morning.



CPSFI had approached Athletics Federation of India to provide support to conduct the championship by providing technical officials /volunteers including program /start list, who in turn authorised Delhi State Athletics Association for needful.

The list of officials who are technically qualified is attached.

The event of CPSFI National Athletics Championship was conducted in a smooth manner and it technically well organised with a total of 30 Qualified technical officials and 10 sports athletics specific volunteers.
